Founding President David Mason honored

When **Addison Koella** wanted to do something to honor **David Mason**, the driving force behind Sunset Rotary, he looked for a project that would help people and be a fitting tribute to our founding president. Thus, it is appropriate that the Sunset Rotary Club in conjunction with the Rotary Club of Kabale, Uganda, South Africa, funded the **Dr. David Mason Eco-San Toiletry Facility** "to help relieve the children of Kabale School District."

Addison says the project cost would have been prohibitive without the help of the Enrichment Federal Credit Union, which waived fees for the numerous attempts at wire transfers of funds to central Africa. He says another stumbling point was when the Kabale club president Jennifer Ngali died a few months into the project. "Her nice disposition was the whole reason I chose the Rotary Club of Kabale," says Addison.

Polio Plus Update: Polio Is Alive in the World

Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for 25 years and is making great progress, but the job isn't finished. Even though there are only a few cases in the world, we continue to spend \$700 million each year because every child has to be vaccinated – some multiple times – to make the world free of this disease.

Since Rotary began the effort to eradicate polio, cases have been reduced by >99%. Polio is now endemic in only four countries: Nigeria, India, Pakistan, and Afghanistan. Tajikistan had 75% of the 1600 cases in the world last year. The goal of CDC is no reported cases of polio in the world by the end of 2012.

The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation gave Rotary \$355 million, but we have to match that with \$200 million by June 2012. To date we have raised \$142.2. Last year our district donated about \$186,000, and this year we will again have a community-based project in which we place labeled cans at local businesses that ask the public to drop in their change for Polio eradication. The District will provide a series of press releases for area newspapers. Clubs that give an average of \$40/member are recognized as Eradicator Clubs. Sunset Rotary was an Eradicator Club last year, and one of the Club goals for this year is to repeat that donation.



Heitman pointed out that money given immediately can earn additional money when it is invested, so he requests that we send our money ASAP.
