Program Highlights

To Win, You Have to Rebound!

Chuck Carringer

Kenneth Herring introduced the speaker, who was his former basketball coach and mentor. Formerly Carringer was head basketball coach at Jefferson Middle School and Oak Ridge High School and then Principal of ORHS.

Carringer introduced his inspiring talk by stating that the game of basketball requires offence, defense, and rebounding, and there is a strong correlation between good rebounding and winning. He pointed out that people are hardwired to want to win or be successful. In teaching, the toughest student to work with is not the rowdy one, but the one who is apathetic because he is afraid of failing.

No one make every basket, but worse than missing is being afraid to shoot. The key to success is rebounding. Carringer discussed four characteristics of rebounders:

1. They have a healthy view of themselves, even after a miss. They recognize that the bigger things you try, the more you miss, but they never view themselves as failures.
2. They take responsibility. The first requirement of a leader is to define reality. Setbacks, like winning, are a process, not an event. Principle of a path: a path can be followed, and it leads to a predictable end. In most areas of life there is a predictable outcome. For example, you know if you don't lead a healthy life style, you probably won't be healthy.
3. Rebounders develop a plan of action. They live with purpose and intentionality. There is a gap between where you are and where you want to be. To fill the gap, you have to be willing to make necessary changes.
4. Rebounders are persistent. Carringer told about his own experience as a child who loved basketball. However, when he tried out for the team, he didn't make it. He practiced and tried again four more times. It was not until he was a senior in high school that he finally made the team, but he tried out every year.
